The 2022 review of Library services was reported to Cabinet in October 2022. It confirmed that after consultation with the staff and public about the role of Gateshead libraries, that the 5 council library buildings consulted on would be recognised as "community spaces" and that they will become a part of the Councils locality working approach. It was also recognised that the future arrangement of library and other services within council buildings will vary from place to place and will be driven by local circumstances – success rests on reflecting and responding to local need so every community space will be different.

St Mary's is not a part of the statutory library service and as such was not a part of that consultation process.

The service withdrawal from St Mary's will allow staff resources to be targeted into the locality model.
